The new Weight Loss Drug clinical study:

The practice is currently recruiting participants to take part in a clinical study researching the effectiveness of a new weight loss drug. The study is being led by Dr Nick Thomas (one of our GPs). The medication is called AZD5004 and would be effective and safe for overweight patients to help reduce their weight. The medication works by making you feel less hungry and more full for a longer period after eating – reducing the drive to eat.

This medication works by making you feel less hungry and fuller after eating for a longer period, therefore reducing the drive to eat. If you are overweight with at least one weight-related medical condition, or if you are living with obesity and interested in taking part, then you can find links to the relevant information on the Windrush website.
